Competition Comment

These were great submissions and show a lot of promise. The deciding factor usually resolved with the degree to which a given submission stood on its own while also putting a premium on journalistic effort. This isn't the infographic category, Alternative Story Formats stand apart with greater emphasis on text and engagement. Magazines use ASFs religiously, especially in the front of the book section. Which in the older style magazines, can run really heavy on text, but still run the reader around a gambit of stories and make them feel wordly -- like they read 2x more than they actually did. The style has creeped into newsletter and digital-first formats like Axios, and also defunct formats like Quartz' chatbot stories and Vox card stacks. These didn't fail because ASF is dying, rather ASF is becoming ubiquitous with the wider newsroom. Hone this craft and you'll go far

The drawings themselves here are all good quality. The challenge, it appears, is aligning the drawings with the stories they're intended to illustrate. Make certain that artists are in touch with the writers AND the designers, to assure that good work gets the sort of display it should get. And keep in mind that IJEA's guidelines for this category say that the illustration is to be the "dominant art" accompanying a story -- and if the story and/or page isn't submitted with the illustration, a judge has no way of determining whether that is the case.

Probably 10-15 of these photos could have been deleted, and doing so would have made the gallery stronger. Still, this is a solid job of visual storytelling. Volleyball is a difficult sport to photograph, and this gallery has some exceptionally good action shots. I have two pieces of technical advice: (1) Try taking volleyball photos while standing behind the opposing team. Don't worry about the net getting in the way of your team's players. You can get some great facial expressions this way. (2) Definitely use Photoshop or the equivalent to get rid of some of the darkness in these photos. High school gyms don't always have the best lighting, so go big on using whatever photo editing software you have. Again, nice job!
