The video is almost four and a half minutes long, but it really should be no more than a minute and half. In fact, with some tight editing, you could produce an extremely informative, fast-paced and engaging 60-second video. There's lots of footage here that could and should have been removed. Some suggestions for how this video could have been improved, which can also apply to future videos: (1) Edit, edit, edit. By that I mean: Listen closely to your interviews and only use the best sound bites, the comments that truly pertain to the central focus of your video. Delete everything else. Be ruthless in what you cut. Your viewers will thank you. (2) Use title graphics to identify your speakers. Don't waste time by having them say (or spell!) their names. (3) Use more B-roll. Don't just let people talk and talk. Show us some action that is relevant to what they're saying. (4) If you're going to use a narrator, the narrator should give us essential information right at the start. What is RAD? What is a RAD event? What is this particular RAD event? I still don't know what RAD is, although I can guess. I had to wait until the 3:45 mark before someone explained what this particular RAD event was. Don't assume that all of your viewers know these things. It's tempting to do so, but failing to provide essential background info is the surest way to get people to stop watching. No one wants to be confused, and no one is going to stop and do research to answer questions that should have been answered at the beginning of the video. (5) Use external microphones who recording interviews. Don't rely on the internal mic in your camera. The best mic is a wireless mic that can be attached to the interviewee's collar or lapel or lanyard. The "Rode" brand offers excellent and affordable wireless mics. Using them will improve your audio quality significantly. (6) Show us kids in action. This was an event at a middle school, right? Where are those kids? Or wasn't this event aimed at kids? Again, I shouldn't hav to ask a question like that. The video should cover that within the first 15-20 seconds. don't mean to discourage the students who produced this video. There was a lot of potential here. But taking raw footage and turning it into a compelling video requires intense focus and the willingness to cut and revise, cut and revise. I hope these suggestions can be applied to future videos Keep on creating
